Personal data we process

DENROOIJEN Photography processes your personal data because you use our services and/or because you provide it to us yourself. Below you will find an overview of the personal data we process:

We do not use social media plugins.

Special and/or sensitive personal data we process

Our website and/or service does not intend to collect data on website visitors who are under 16 years of age. Unless they have permission from parents or guardians. However, we cannot check whether a visitor is older than 16. We therefore advise parents to be involved in their children's online activities to avoid collecting data on children without parental consent. For what purpose and on what basis we process personal data

How long we keep personal data

DENROOIJEN Photography does not keep your personal data for longer than strictly necessary to realise the purposes for which your data are collected. Based on tax legislation, the retention period is at least 7 years.

Sharing personal data with third parties

DENROOIJEN Photography only provides personal data to third parties if this is necessary for the performance of our agreement with you or to comply with a legal obligation.

Cookies, or similar techniques, we use

DENROOIJEN Photography does not use cookies or similar techniques on its website.

View, modify or delete data

You have the right to view, correct or delete your personal data. You also have the right to withdraw your possible consent for data processing or to object to the processing of your personal data by our company, and you have the right to data portability. This means you can submit a request to us to send the personal data we hold on you in a computer file to you or another organisation named by you. To ensure that the request for inspection is made by you, we ask you to send a copy of your proof of identity along with the request. In this copy, black out your passport photo, MRZ (machine readable zone, the strip of numbers at the bottom of the passport), passport number and Citizen Service Number (BSN). This is to protect your privacy. DENROOIJEN Photography will respond to your request as soon as possible, but in any case within four weeks. DENROOIJEN Photography would also like to inform you that you have the possibility to file a complaint with the national supervisory authority, the Dutch Data Protection Authority (Autoriteit Persoonsgegevens).
